Whether at the beach, pool, or lake, water safety is key to keeping our children safe while they have fun in the sun. Summer may be carefree, but we must stay mindful—because every child deserves a childhood that is safe, healthy, and full of joy.

Here are a few simple water safety tips to keep in mind:

### Start with these basics:

- Always keep an eye on children around water no distractions.
- Never rely on floaties or toys as a substitute for supervision.
- Teach kids to swim and understand water rules early.
- Use pool fences and locked gates to keep unsupervised children out.
- Keep a phone nearby for emergencies but don't scroll!

We encourage you to talk with your children about water safety and make a family plan. A little preparation goes a long way toward making this summer both fun and safe.

### **Water Safety Facts**



Children can drown in as little as 1 inch of water.



Most drownings happen silently and quickly— within 2 minutes and often with a caregiver nearby.

## 2025 Walton Leadership Class



All classes are held at the CARES Center and require advance registration to attend. In each session, you'll learn about the latest safe sleep recommendations, how to reduce the risk of SIDS (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome), and tips for setting up a sleep space that supports your baby's health and safety. 


## Back to School Campaign.




